## Private GEORGE ALBERT SAVINS

5387117, 2nd Bn., Highland Light Infantry (City of Glasgow Regiment) who died age 25 on 19 July 1944

Son of Edward and Edith Annie Savins; husband of Kathleen Savins, of Lower Apperley, Remembered with honour at ST. MANVIEU WAR CEMETERY, CHEUX

We do not have a photograph of **Pte**. **Savins** perhaps because he was only connected to Apperley by his marriage to Kathleen Flight in May 1944 at Deerhurst Church. However, in a short report, the *Register* recorded that, aged 25, he originated in Oxfordshire.

He is buried in the same cemetery in Normandy as L/Cpl. Davis of Twyning but died two weeks later during the long campaign to break out of Normandy six weeks after D-Day. We do not know of any family connection with Glasgow but his battalion landed in France on June 13, fighting near the Odon River, south of Caen during Operation Goodwood which was a second attempted breakout by General Montgomery.<sup>1</sup>
