




- 1937 Swansea

















This railway bridge, below Glowester, was destroyed in 1960, when the oil barges ARKENDALE and WESTERNDALE struck the bridge. Five of the eight crewmen were killed. The bridge was never rebuilt. Many schoolchildren had to change schools, permanently, as a result, since the railway was closed.
